On the 23rd day of June 1845 a power with the will annexed

in the County of Middlesex deceased was granted to Edward Henry
Corbould one of the natural and lawful children and as one
of the ordinary delegates named in the said will having a
true and just sworn duty to administer. Richard Thomas, in the will a
well as Richard Corbould his brother of the deceased the sole Execu-
tor named in the said will having assumed the probate and as
Executor thereof as by bills of Court appears.
